YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING MANDATORY - EVERYONE MUST COMPLETE THE NEW YPT



BSA National has released a new, updated YPT training which is mandatory for EVERY leader (regardless of program) to complete by October 1,

2018, no matter when you completed another YPT course. Youth participants 18 and over must also complete YPT. It is also required for all adults at a camping event lasting more than 72 hours – even if not consecutive. It is available on-line ONLY. Users must have or register for a my. Scouting account. YPT consists of 3 modules and a test and requires about 1 hour. **Information How to Take YPT2** Don't wait until the last minute to complete your training when the site may become slowed or overwhelmed.

MERIT BADGE COUNSELORS



Merit Badge Counselors have been contacted to remind them that All Counselors must complete the new YPT before Oct 1st, 2018 and Merit Badge Counselor

Training. If YPT is not completed, all current members will have their membership terminated. They will be removed from the data base and a new approved Merit Badge list will be sent to Advancement Chairs. Those who want to be Merit Badge Counselors will have to reapply as a new adult with a new adult application, Merit Badge Information sheet, YPT completion documentation and approval by the District Advancement Chair.
